

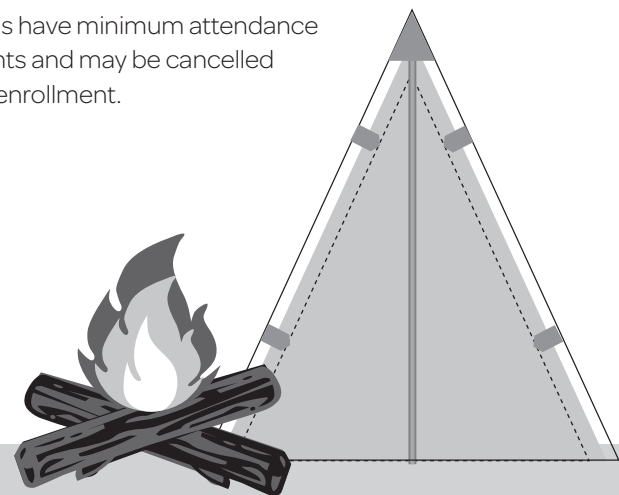

INSTRUCTIONS FOR OVERNIGHT PROGRAMS

- Museums require a ratio of 1 adult to every 5 girls, so please be sure to include enough adults at your overnight. Due to limited amount of spaces, the number of adults attending can only be the required number to meet the girl/adult ratios found in Safety Activity Checkpoints.
- **Reminder:** Each troop must have a Troop Trips II trained adult in order to attend.
- Payment is due with registration. Numbers are final, no changes in troop numbers will be accepted after this time.
- Refunds will only be made if a troop can find a replacement troop.
- Do not call the museum for more details or for registration information. These overnights are planned and scheduled through GSSNE unless otherwise indicated.

REGISTRATION TIPS

- Registration and financial aid forms are available at www.gssne.org
- Use a separate form for each program you are registering for.
- If a program is “Troop Only”, use that registration form instead of the individual girl form.
- You must be a registered Girl Scout in order to sign up for a program or activity in this guide. **Not registered yet, or have a friend who wants to go on an adventure with you? No problem! You can join at the same time you sign up for a program – just add \$25 to your payment.**
- Fee must be paid with registration; we cannot hold space without payment.
- Registrations are accepted on a first come, first served basis.
- Deadline for registration is two calendar weeks prior to the event or as noted. **Register early to make sure your girl doesn’t miss out on the fun!**
- Confirmations with location and directions will be mailed or emailed. Please do not plan on attending until you receive a confirmation.
- Refunds for events will be made only with written notice no less than two weeks prior to the event. Refunds are processed after the event.
- During inclement weather, call the council office at (401) 331-4500 or (800) 331-0149 for a pre-recorded message about program cancellations. If there is no message, the programs will still be held.
- At Girl Scouts we strive to ensure that every girl, regardless of ability to pay, has the opportunity to participate. Financial assistance is available based on need. Call the council office at (401) 331-4500 or (800) 331-0149 for more information.
- All programs have minimum attendance requirements and may be cancelled due to low enrollment.



EVENT ETIQUETTE

- **Be prepared!** Check your confirmation for site address. Locate it on a map and bring directions. (Please note that some GPS units may not work in all areas.)
- **Arrive on time.** Remember to allow time for walking from where you park to the event site.
- Please **respect** and **help** the program facilitator as needed. Remind girls that a **“thank you”** is always appreciated.
- Tag-a-longs: Siblings or non-Girl Scout members are not permitted at any Girl Scout program unless specified. Babysitting is not provided during events. We encourage you to ask other adults to babysit as a service to the troop.
- Because adult/child ratios must be met, unless otherwise noted by facilitator, adults should plan on attending and may be asked to assist.

Basic Qualifications

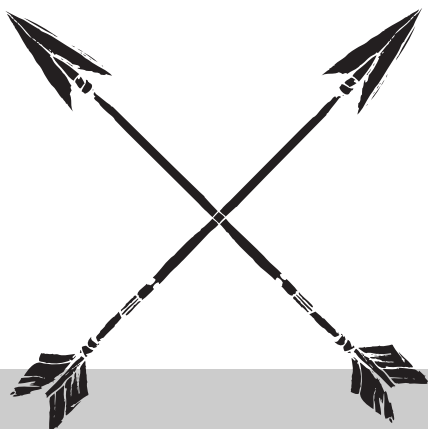
- You must be at least 18 years of age or older.
- Flexible attitude and sense of humor.
- Be a positive role model for the leaders of tomorrow.
- You must enroll as a member of Girl Scouts of the USA (GSUSA).
- Membership Dues of \$15 goes to GSUSA to pay for accident insurance covering participation in approved Girl Scout activities, program research and resources, training and services to councils.

GIRL LEADERSHIP EXPERIENCE CENTER

The Center is located within the Council office at 500 Greenwich Avenue in Warwick, Rhode Island and boasts 10,000 square feet of space to be utilized by our girls. The Center includes a lounge exclusively for girls to use and three conference rooms that can be used for separate meetings or as a large gathering place, comfortably fitting 100 people. There is free parking and the Center is handicapped accessible.

Several events and programs have been held in the Center since it opened, including a Junior Business Owner Badge Workshop, a Zumba dance party, an "In Her Shoes" panel discussion with leading business women, luncheons, trainings for adult volunteers and Board meetings. The Center holds wonderful potential for even more programming and events. This year girls at every age level will be able to utilize the Center. Daisies can create wings during a Fairy Princess Workshop, Brownies can "Investigate the Arts" and older girls can use the space for planning meetings before heading out on a hike or photography expedition, for a "Dollar Design" series or for Leadership, Babysitting or First Aid/CPR training.

Thanks to generous donors, including Amica Insurance and the East Greenwich Rotary Club, the Center is being outfitted with technology, furnishings and supplies. CAMP PROPERTIES & LOCATIONS

Our beautiful camp properties are available to Girl Scout troops throughout the year...for one-day "outdoor days" or overnight camping – even during winter! Girl Scout camps are a place for girls to explore their world in a safe, comfortable setting.

Girl Scouts of Southeastern New England owns four beautiful camp properties, carefully maintained by our property staff for the benefit of our girls, alumnae, adult volunteers and the community at large.

Camp Cookie is located in Glocester, RI, on 95 acres of oak and pine woodlands. Lodge sleeps 18 girls and 2 adults. A hardtop tent unit is also available.

Camp Hoffman is located in West Kingston, RI. The camp is situated on the shores of Larkin Pond and is known for its beautiful pine groves, open meadows, a historical cemetery; hiking trails and a deluxe ropes challenge course! Longhouse sleeps 32 girls and 10 adults. Wellville sleeps 24 girls and 5 adults. New Old House sleeps 10 girls and 4 adults. Platform tent units also available.

Camp Rocky Farm is located in Newport, RI, within walking distance of Ocean Drive. Lodge sleeps 16 girls and 4 adults.

Camp Promising Acres is located in Swansea, MA. A full-size in-ground swimming pool and 140 acres of hills, ponds and streams make this camp unique. Lodge sleeps 12 girls and 2 adults. Platform tent unit available.

HIGHEST AWARDS



Earning the Girl Scout Bronze, Silver and Gold Award involves the time to complete a Journey and then a minimum number of hours building your team, exploring your community, choosing your project, planning it, putting your plan into motion and spreading the word about your project.

Check your Girls' Guide to Girl Scouting or our website for additional information and required paperwork.

Girl Scout Bronze Award for girls in 4th and 5th grades. Minimum of 20 hours. Team project.

Girl Scout Silver Award for girls in 6th, 7th, and 8th grades. Minimum of 50 hours. Work solo or in a team of 2 to 3 girls. Project pre-approval by Council Higher Awards Committee required.

Girl Scout Gold Award for girls in 9th through 12th grades. Minimum of 80 hours. Work solo. Project pre-approval by Council Higher Awards Committee.

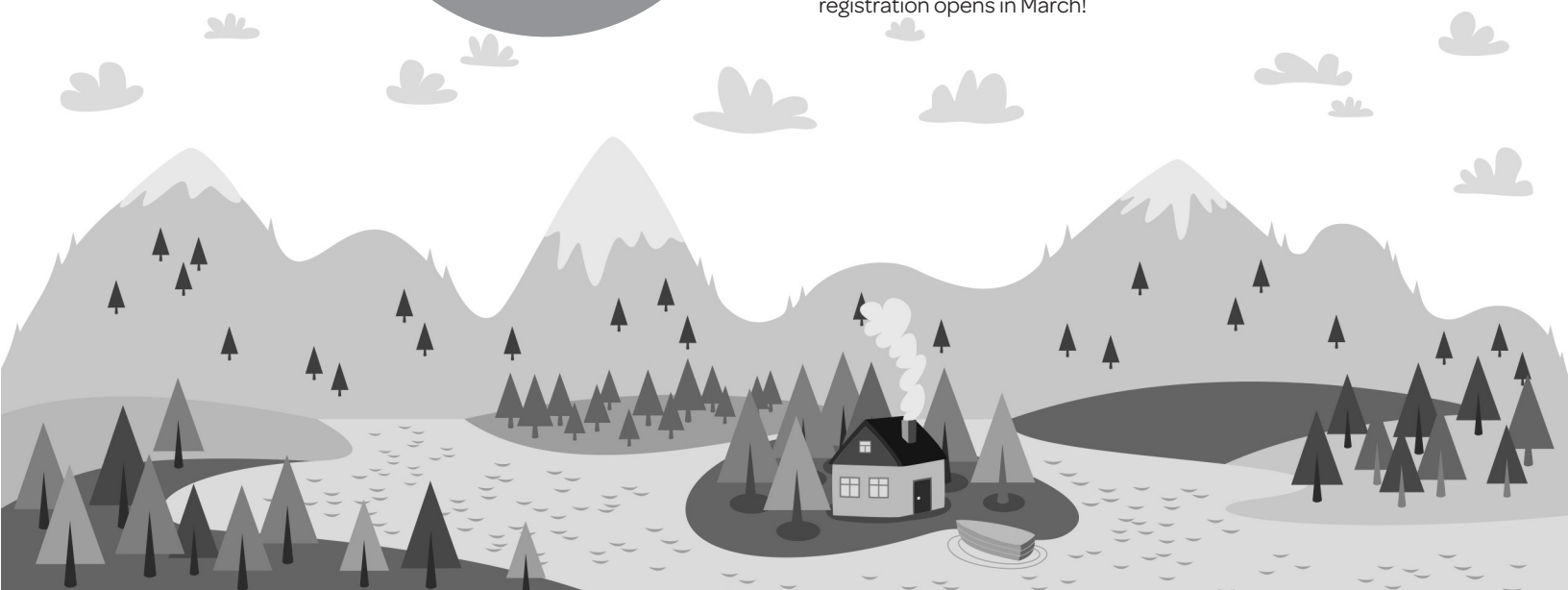
Give your girl a summer to remember

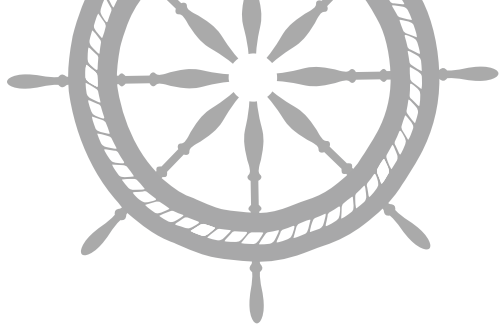

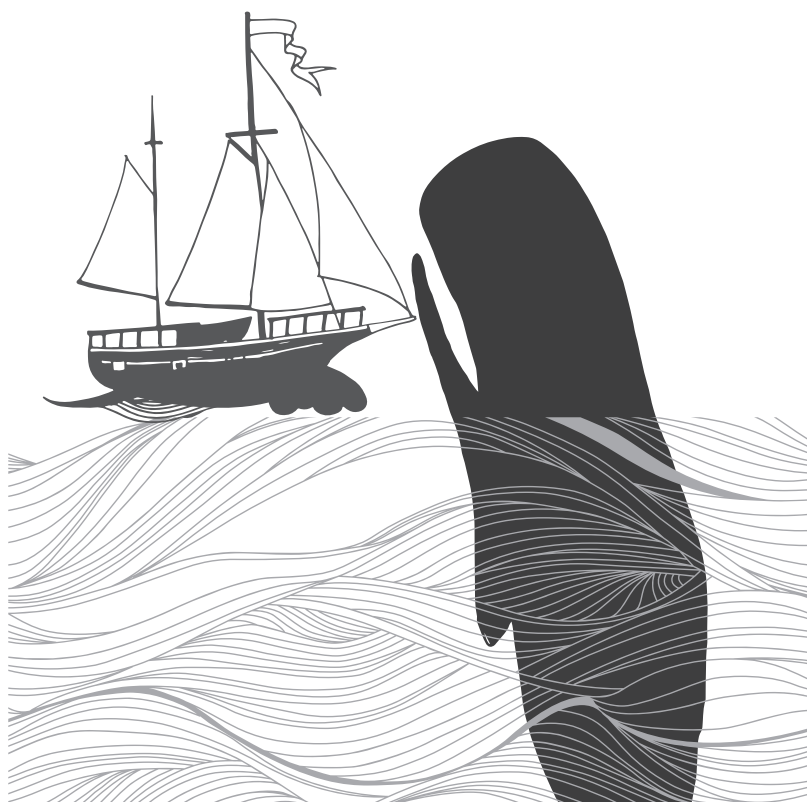
