DAY CAMP

WHAT IS DAY CAMP? ←

For a well-rounded camp experience with lots of variety, Girl Scout Day Camp is the place to be! Girls enjoy the fun and variety of swimming, craft projects, environmental education, songs, and adventure. And just to be sure every child stays interested and engaged, our one-week day camp is designed around a weekly theme, providing an opportunity to experience something new, learn new skills, and meet new challenges. For girls who are interested in experiencing camp for more than a week, we also offer two-week sessions that focus on outdoor living skills. Our outdoor-oriented day camps feature unique eco-science and nature study programs. All programs are grade level based and are offered to **girls in grades K-9**. What's unique about Girl Scout Camp? Girl-lead decision making. As a group, the girls decide which activities they would like to participate in. Special activity days occur each week with a cookout and an all-camp event.

WHAT TO EXPECT ←

At day camp, girls are grouped into "units" by grade and experience. Camp begins with a morning flag ceremony. Throughout the day, girls may participate in a wide variety of activities including hiking, games, sports, cooking, arts and crafts and nature exploration.

Weather permitting, girls swim twice a day – one free swim period and one swim lesson period. The exception to this is Camp Rocky Farm, where girls spend time at the oceanfront two or three times a week instead. While girls primarily stay within their units, they will have plenty of opportunities to participate in all-camp activities like camp talent shows! Each day ends with a closing flag ceremony.

While we do our best to ensure that all activities listed for each camp are accomplished during their week at camp; schedules may need to change due to weather or other factors that are beyond our control.

This year the new rock wall will be traveling between Camp Cookie, Camp Rocky Farm and Camp Promising Acres. Campers at Camp Green Forest will use the deluxe ropes challenge course and climbing walls already on the property.

OUR 4 DAY CAMPS ←

CAMP COOKIE ▶ GLOCESTER, RI

Situated on 95 acres of oak and pine woodlands. Girls participate in swimming lessons and recreational swim in a natural pond.

CAMP GREEN FOREST ▶ WEST KINGSTON, RI

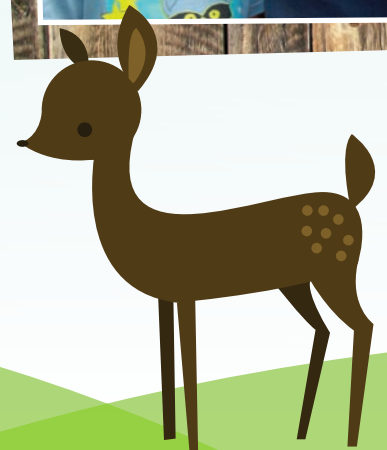
Situated on 170 acres on the shores of Larkin Pond. Girls participate in swimming lessons and recreational swim in a natural pond, as well as use the ropes challenge course.

CAMP PROMISING ACRES ▶ SWANSEA, MA

A full-size in-ground swimming pool and 140 acres of hills, ponds and streams are what make this camp unique. Camp Promising Acres must comply with the regulations of the Massachusetts Department of Public Health and be licensed by Rehoboth and Swansea Board of Health. CAMP ROCKY FARM ▶ NEWPORT, RI

Camp Rocky Farm will be open for sessions **1, 1A, 2, 3, 3A and 4 only**. Girls visit the nearby beach 2-3 times per week for recreational swimming, games and beachcombing.

ENTERING GRADES K-1: Camp Samplers

This unit is especially for first-time campers. Try a little of everything! Make lots of new friends and have a great time.

ENTERING GRADES 2-3: Camp Explorers

A little more experienced, these campers get to explore the camp!

ENTERING GRADE 4: Camp Adventurers

Awesome adventure awaits you every day. Perfect your outdoor skills as you try archery.

ENTERING GRADES 5-6: Pathfinders

Learn new outdoor skills, follow new paths and try new recipes!

ENTERING GRADES 7 AND UP: Trailblazers

Begin planning on your own as you learn the importance of working with others. Try advanced campcraft ... the adventure and the experience are up to you!

SPECIAL LEADERSHIP PROGRAMS

Water Safety Instructor Aide ▶ July 5 - 7 ▶ Cost: \$330

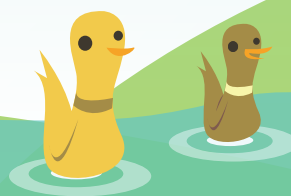
(Entering Grade 9 and up; must swim at an intermediate level) Located at Camp Promising Acres, this intensive course includes several hours of pool instruction, while you perfect your strokes and learn about teaching styles. During your two-week apprenticeship at one of GSRI's day camps, you will assist with swimming instruction while you learn how a safe and effective waterfront program is managed. This resident program begins at 9:00 am.

Buddy Up! ▶ July 8 - 12 ▶ Cost: \$275

(Entering Grade 9 and up) Girls will learn to improve their basic camp skills, such as fire building, lashing, arts and crafts, orienteering, songs & games. Then they'll teach younger campers these skills and more! Attend five days of training at Camp Cookie, Camp Green Forest, or Camp Promising Acres followed by a one-week apprenticeship at a GSRI day camp at no additional fee. This is a day program.

Buddy Up! and Water Safety Aide Volunteers

(Entering Grade 10 and up) Share your love of camp! If you've completed Water Safety Instructor Aide training or Buddy Up! training, then we encourage you to spend a session as a volunteer sharing those skills with younger girls. Though you won't get paid, you'll be able to earn community service hours. You may volunteer at any session offered, but space for aides is limited. To apply, submit a day camp registration form and you will be contacted by the Camp Director if you've been selected as an aide. Aides are accepted on a first come, first served basis. There is no cost for aides at any day camp but if you take the bus, there is a bus fee.





SESSION THEMES

SESSION 1: OOEEY, GOOEY FUN

July 8 - 12 ▶ Cost: \$180

Are you into ooze and goo? Can you make bubbles bigger than yourself? Have fun all week with wacky and weird science experiments and even make your own silly putty!

SESSION 2: ECO CHIC

July 15 - 19 ▶ Cost: \$180

Learn how to make several products that are eco-friendly like lotion, shampoo, and more. You will also embellish a canvas, reusable shopping bag!

SESSION 3: PAINT UP A STORM

July 22 - 26 ▶ Cost: \$180

Spend a week exploring all the arts & crafts that camp has to offer. Try new painting techniques. Use water colors, oil paints, tempera paint, even shaving cream!

SESSION 4: GIRL DETECTIVES

July 29 - August 2 ▶ Cost: \$180

Follow clues and "crack mysteries" like a real detective. You'll discover codes and learn about fingerprints.

SESSION 5: GLOBE TROTTER

August 5 - 9 ▶ Cost: \$180

Explore the art and culture of distant lands. Learn about customs, music, stories, and dance from each of the six inhabited continents. Enhance your appreciation and understanding of people from around the globe.

SESSION 6: CHEF GIRL R DEE

August 13 - 16 ▶ Cost: \$150

Bring your appetites! You'll get hands on experience making a variety of delicious foods. Create your own recipe book with recipes that you use all week.

Generations of girls have enjoyed the pristine beauty of our four camp locations – **Camp Hoffman / Camp Green Forest** on the shores of Larkin Pond in South County, **Camp Cookie** in the forests and rocky farmland of northwest Rhode Island, **Camp Promising Acres** with its large, beautiful swimming pool in Swansea, MA and **Camp Rocky Farm**, just steps away from the breathtaking views from Ocean Drive in Newport.

Camping is a great way to build new skills and confidence, get a sense of community, and develop a deep appreciation for nature. Whether you go for a day, a week or longer, Girl Scout camping gives you an opportunity to grow, explore, and have fun—in a nurturing all-girl environment, and always under the guidance of caring, trained adults.

WHO CAN ATTEND? ←

- Girl Scout camp is for every girl, everywhere. **Both girls who are registered Girl Scouts and non-Girl Scouts are welcome to attend camp** without regard to race, color, ethnicity, religion, national origin or socio-economic status.
- Girls who are not currently registered Girl Scouts are able to register for an additional fee of just \$12.
- Girls entering grades K-9 are welcome at any of our day camps.
- Girls entering grades 2-12 may attend overnight camp at Camp Hoffman.
- Girls in grades 9-12 may attend our leadership programs. See individual programs for specific ages.

Registration

ONLINE: For fast and convenient online camp registration, visit www.gsri.org. Only credit cards are accepted. New this year: to register for summer camp online please use the same login account used for membership renewal.

BY MAIL: Complete the 2013 Camp Registration Form and submit to GSRI with check, money order or credit card.

Fees

Program fees vary according to camp, program and length of session. Program fees are subsidized by Girl Scouts of Rhode Island, Inc. in order to keep camp affordable for as many girls as possible. For current fees, please refer to each camp's program description.

Deposits

A non-refundable deposit of \$35 per session is required and will be deducted from the total balance due. Girls not currently registered as Girl Scouts will also need to pay a one-time fee of \$12, the cost of Girl Scouts of the USA's annual membership fee. This GSUSA membership is valid through September 30, 2013.

Payment

Camp fees may be paid by cash, check, money order (payable to GSRI) or credit card (MasterCard, Visa, American Express). A non-refundable deposit is required with your application and the balance is due by June 1, 2013. GSRI reserves the right to cancel reservations if full payment is not received by June 1, 2013. Refunds due to overpayment will be processed after August 1, 2013. Check, money order and credit card payments may be mailed or faxed. Do not mail cash. Cash payment must be brought to the council office.

Financial Aid Requests

Financial aid to attend a GSRI summer camp program – day or overnight – is available for girls who, without this assistance, would not be able to attend Girl Scout camp. Families applying for financial aid should expect to pay as much as they possibly can toward the fee. The \$35 per session deposit must accompany the camper registration and will be refunded if financial aid is not granted. Financial aid is not limited to one session. Applications may be downloaded from our website.

Cookie Credits

Each GSRI Girl Scout receives 20 cents per box of Girl Scout Cookies sold that she is able to use toward GSRI summer camp fees. **All transfers must be requested in writing by April 29, 2013 at 5pm.** Cookie credit procedures may be found at www.gsri.org.

Early Bird Discount

A \$25 discount is offered to girls who register and pay their deposit between March 4-8, 2013. This discount is applied to the balance after the deposit is paid.

Cancellations and Refunds

Deposits are not transferable and will not be refunded unless GSRI cannot place a girl in the session/program of her choice. No refunds are made if a camper leaves camp due to homesickness, late arrival, early departure, inappropriate behavior or personal choice. A refund of fee balance will only be made under unforeseen circumstances and by written request, received two weeks prior to the start of the camp session or program. There are no refunds for cookie credits, financial aid awards, or deposits.

Transfer Fee

Once a registration has been processed, there will be a \$15 fee each time a change of camp or session is made.

Girls with Special Needs

Parents or guardians of girls with special dietary needs, mobility limitations over rough terrain, or health conditions requiring particular awareness should contact Laurie Pansa at (401) 331-4500 ext. 1400 or (800) 331-0149 ext. 1400 prior to registration in order to ensure that the girl can safely participate in camp activities.

Getting There

DAY CAMP: For just \$15 per session (\$25 for session 1A, 2A, 3A or 4A), camp buses will pick up and drop off your child at a safe location. A complete listing of bus stops is posted on our website. Please indicate your preferred bus stop on your registration form. Exact drop off and pick up times will be posted on the website two weeks prior to the beginning of each camp session. **Bus transportation is mandatory for Camp Cookie.**

OVERNIGHT CAMP: Girls are responsible for their own transportation to the resident and special programs at Camp Hoffman. Parents are encouraged to form car pools.

Sparklers ▶ **Cost: \$415**

Make camp shine! Try the things that make camp fun, including archery, swimming, nature, art and more. You'll even plan an activity to share with another unit or the whole camp!

Summer Getaway ▶ **Cost: \$430**

Take a break from your busy life to get away and retreat to beautiful Larkin Pond for a luxurious week. Learn to give yourself a manicure and pedicure, make your own bath salts, soaps, and candles, try yoga and learn how to listen to your body. You'll also enjoy kayaking or canoeing on the pond, shooting at the archery range, outdoor cooking, swimming, painting, and making summertime memories.

Theater in the Woods ▶ **Cost: \$415**

Put your talent to the test, whether on stage or behind the scenes. Create costumes, design props, and memorize your lines as you prepare a performance for both the camp and your family.

The Pirate Life ▶ **Cost: \$415**

Ahoy, matey! Spend the week following a map to buried treasure, participating in a counselor hunt, playing games on the water and perhaps you will even see some pirates on Larkin Pond! In addition to the pirate fun, you will explore parts of the camp from the 1920s while learning to hike and cook outdoors, go swimming, visit the challenge course, and do the other things that make camp fun.

Top Chef: Outdoors ▶ **Cost: \$430**

Learn to cook amazing meals from around the world – outdoors! Of course you'll also have the chance to enjoy traditional camp activities including swimming, arts and crafts, games, hiking, nature walks and making new friends.

Voyageurs ▶ **Cost: \$465**

Learn how to safely maneuver a canoe across Larkin Pond before embarking on a fun, one-day trip on a local river. Spend the rest of your stay enjoying traditional camp activities including swimming, arts and crafts, games, hiking, nature walks and making new friends.*

Windjammers I ▶ **Cost: \$450**

3-Day General Program ▶ Cost: \$220

Three days of fun in the sun await you! Sample the things that make Camp Hoffman great- art, swimming, nature exploration, singing and more! This program is available for grades 2 and up. Girls will be placed in units by age/grade.

A³ ▶ Cost: \$430

Art, Archery, & Adventure- Create some amazing art, practice your bull's eye, and spend time on our challenge course!

Adventure Seekers ▶ Cost: \$415

Get the skills you need to survive in the wilds of Camp Hoffman! You'll learn all about outdoor cooking, boating, trail blazing, hiking, low impact camping and much more. Clues about the next day's adventure or challenge will arrive via "tree mail".

Barns & Bridles ▶ Cost: \$675

Spend four full days at the stables learning how to ride and take care of a horse. The rest of the time you'll enjoy what summer camp life has to offer such as swimming, boating, arts & crafts, hiking and archery. Please note that due to extended stable times, girls may not receive swimming lessons every day.

Brownie Magic ▶ Cost: \$415

A sampler program designed especially for girls who are attending overnight camp for the first time. Experience arts and crafts, swimming in the lake, games, campfires, nature walks, cooking s'mores, and making lots of friends and wonderful memories.

Bull's Eye ▶ Cost: \$430

By spending time each day at the archery range, you'll be able to complete challenges from the Junior Olympic Archery Challenge in order to earn your Arrow Award. Of course you'll have time for other fun camp activities, too, including swimming, hiking, arts & crafts and more!

Challengers ▶ Cost: \$465

Learn everything there is to know about our low ropes challenge course! You'll play games, work together with your friends, and challenge yourself! You'll also have plenty of time to do the other things that make camp great; like swimming, art, nature exploration, and more!

Counselor In Training I ▶ Cost: \$515

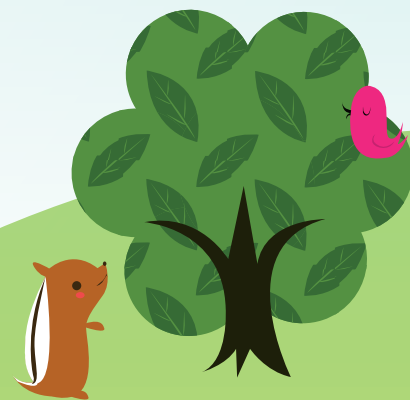
