REGISTRATION PROCEDURES



- * All registration questions should be directed to the Registration Department.
- * Contact the Program Contact only with questions specific to the program, such as: attire, to make special needs arrangements, etc.
- * Register for the programs and activities in this guide using the forms in the back. Make duplicate copies of these forms for future use. Forms can also be found on the website at **www.gsri.org**.
- * Telephone registrations for programs will only be accepted with payment by credit card (MasterCard, Visa and American Express only.) A registration form containing all information must be mailed to the council office immediately after securing your reservation by telephone.
- * Submit completed forms and payment by mail or fax or drop them by the council office (open Monday through Friday from 8:00 am to 5:30 pm).
- * Use a separate form for each program you are registering for.
- * You must be a registered Girl Scout in order to sign up for a program or activity in this guide. Not registered yet? No problem. You can register at the same time you sign up for a program. Just add \$12 to your payment.
- * Fee must be paid with registration. We will not hold a space without payment.
- * Registrations are accepted on a first come, first served basis.
- * **Deadlines:** Deadline for registration is **two calendar weeks prior** to the event or as noted. Programs may fill prior to the deadline; please register early.
- * Confirmations: Confirmations with location and directions will be mailed or emailed (if email address is provided) once registrations are processed. Please do not plan on attending until you receive a confirmation.
- * **Refunds:** Refunds for events requiring a fee will be made **ONLY** with written notice no less than two weeks prior to the event. Refunds are processed after the event.
- * Cancellations due to weather: During inclement weather, call the council office at (401) 331-4500 or at (800) 331-0149 for a pre-recorded message about program cancellations. (If there is no message, the programs will still be held).
- * Confidential Financial Assistance: Assistance is available based on need. Call the council office at (401) 331-4500 or (800) 331-0149 for more information.
- * **Safety:** Adult/child ratios must be met for all events. Adults may be asked to assist during program events.
- * All programs have minimum attendance requirements and may be cancelled due to low enrollment.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR OVERNIGHT PROGRAMS



- * The museums require a ratio of 1 adult to every 5 girls, please be sure to include enough adults at your overnight. NOTE: Because we have a limited amount of spaces, the number of adults attending can only be the required number to meet the girl/adult ratios found in Safety Activity Checkpoints.
- * **REMINDER:** Each troop must have a Troop Trips II trained adult in order to attend.
- * **PAYMENT** is due with registration. Numbers are final, no changes in troop numbers will be accepted after this time. If payment is not received two months prior to trip, troop will lose its reservation.
- * **REFUNDS** will only be made if a troop can find a replacement troop.
- * DO NOT CALL THE MUSEUM/AQUARIUM for more details or for registration information. These overnights are planned & scheduled through GSRI only.

CAMP INFORMATION



It's time to start thinking about how you're going to get your girls outdoors and our camp properties are the answer! There's something for everyone, just check this out:

Camp Cookie (Glocester, RI) Lodge sleeps 16 girls and 2 adults. A hardtop tent unit is also available.

Camp Hoffman (W. Kingston, RI) Longhouse sleeps 32 girls and 12 adults. Wellville sleeps 24 girls and 5 adults. New Old House sleeps 10 girls and 4 adults. Platform tent units also available.

Camp Narrow River (Saunderstown, RI) Lodge sleeps 12 girls and 2 adults.

Camp Promising Acres (Swansea, MA) Lodge sleeps 12 girls and 2 adults. Platform tent unit available.

Camp Rocky Farm (Newport, RI) Lodge sleeps 16 girls and 4 adults.

BASIC QUALIFICATIONS

- * You must be a least 18 years of age or older
- * Be a positive role model for the leaders of tomorrow
- * Flexible attitude and sense of humor
- * You must enroll as a Member in Girl Scouts of the USA: GSUSA Membership Dues of \$12 goes to the national organization to pay for accident insurance covering participation in approved Girl Scout activities, program research and resources, training and services to councils.

THE GIRL SCOUT LEADERSHIP EXPERIENCE (GSLE)



The Girl Scout program—that is, what girls do in Girl Scouting—offers incredible opportunities for girls to grow in their leadership skills, develop lifelong friendships, and earn awards along each step of their leadership journeys, no matter what their grade levels, experiences with Girl Scouting, or background. The Girl Scout program is centered around the **Girl Scout Leadership Experience (GSLE)**, and the best way to deliver the GSLE to girls is through journeys—powerful, fun, and exciting books and awards that are the core of the Girl Scout program. Of course, earning and collecting a variety of badges, patches, and pins is also an important Girl Scout tradition that lives on, because doing so encourages girls to learn and demonstrate important skills. And Girl Scout ceremonies and songs continue to link girls with not only with their Girl Scout peers today but also with the many Girl Scouts who came before them.

Today's effective leaders stress collaboration, inclusion, and a commitment to improving the world around them. Girls themselves tell us that a leader is defined not only by the qualities and skills she hones but also by how she uses those skills and qualities to make a difference in the world—to achieve transformational change! For this reason, the **Girl Scout Leadership Experience (GSLE)**—the framework for defining what girls do in Girl Scouting, how they do it, and who will benefit that was borne out of years of research and development—engages girls in three key activities: **discovering who they are and what they value; connecting with others; and taking action to make the world a better place**. The entire Girl Scout program, regardless of the exact topic, is designed to lead to 15 national leadership outcomes (or benefits) that stem from these three keys.
