



INSTRUCTIONS FOR OVERNIGHT PROGRAMS

The museums require a ratio of 1 adult to every 5 girls, please be sure to include enough adults at your overnight. NOTE: Because we have a limited amount of spaces, the number of adults attending can only be the required number to meet the girl/adult ratios found in Safety Activity Checkpoints.

REMINDER: Each troop must have a Troop Trips II trained adult in order to attend.

PAYMENT is due with registration. Numbers are final, no changes in troop numbers will be accepted after this time.

REFUNDS will only be made if a troop can find a replacement troop.

CAMP INFORMATION

It's time to start thinking about how you're going to get your girls outdoors and our camp properties are the answer! There's something for everyone, just check this out:
