Hurricanes threaten more than 47 million people along the United States coast from Maine to Texas, and the number of people threatened is growing. This program introduces participants to the meteorology and oceanography that drive a hurricane as well as current scientific and technological advances in hurricane forecasts. Using examples from historical hurricanes that have made U.S. landfall, groups will investigate the hazards to people and property, and how to be informed as well as best prepared prior to and during a hurricane emergency.

Sand Detectives

The world's beaches are composed of sand that is made from minerals, rock fragments, and/or biomolecules. The attributes of the sand in a particular location are affected by factors including local geology, weather, and wave action. During this program, participants will become sand detectives, tasked with determining the origin and composition of mystery sand samples from around the globe. Using sand grain characteristics such as color, composition, shape, and size, participants will investigate and solve this geological mystery.
