JOB DESCRIPTION UNIT LEADER

Purpose:

To help campers in her unit to understand and live up to the Promise & Law; develop and use a democratic form of government; plan, carry out and evaluate activities; and develop enjoyment and appreciation of the out-of-doors. To direct and supervise the work of staff members in the camp unit.

Accountable to: The Program Director and/or The Camp Director

Principal Duties:

- 1. Attends pre-camp training.
- 2. Knows the girls in the unit and helps them learn to respect the rights of others and to understand differences and similarities of other campers.
- 3. Teaches camping skills and appreciation of the out-of-doors using Girl Scout handbooks as basis.
- 4. Guide's activities and experiences in the unit through use of troop government, girl-leader planning and the Girl Scout program.
- 5. Coordinates unit activities with those of the entire camp.
- 6. Supervises the unit staff delegate jobs, guides them in their work, arranges schedules for time off.
- 7. Supervises unit housekeeping, sanitation, supplies and equipment.
- 8. Assumes responsibility for health and safety of the campers:
 - a) Emphasizes prevention of illness, accidents.
 - b) Reports accidents promptly.
 - c) Keeps nurse informed of health status of campers and unit staff.
 - d) Follow procedures for use of first aid kit in unit and on out of camp trips.
- 9. Acts as hostess for the unit.
- 10. Serves as waterfront guard or watcher if qualified and needed for own unit.
- 11. Keeps records, and makes reports as required.
- 12. Performs other duties as assigned.

Qualifications:

1 General:

- a) Be or become a current member of the Girl Scout Movement and accept the beliefs and principles and ways of work of the organization.
- b) Be able to guide campers and help them learn.
- c) Have the ability to supervise adults and work as a member of a team.
- d) Be interested, know about, and be skilled in the Girl Scout program & safety practices in a camp setting.
- e) Be willing to work in a camp setting.
- 2. Age: 18 years of age minimum.
- 3. Training and Experience
 - a) Training in the Girl Scout program, camp counseling, and/or leadership techniques.
 - b) Experience as a camper, youth leader or teacher.
 - c) Experience in supervision
